Islam's Justification For Lying to Infidels

“Islam is the only major religion with a developed doctrine of deception.”
Richard Spencer – *The Complete Infidels Guide to the Koran*.

In fact, this doctrine is so well developed that it has words to describe it.

TAQIYYEH (taqiyya)

Taqiyyeth is the outright, blatant, calculated, sanctioned form of lying to Infidels, used by Muslims, to advance and defend the cause of Islam. According to an authoritative Arabic text, *Al-Taqiyya Fi Al-Islam*, it is of such fundamental importance that virtually every Islamic sect practices it. In the modern era, it is frequently used to advance their Islamic, political agenda and deflect criticism of Islam after an act of jihadist violence.

KITMAN (kithman)

Kitman is related to Taqiyyeh, but it is cleverer in that, instead of outright lying, the speaker tells only that part of the truth that suits his purpose. For example, Islamic spokesmen frequently claim Islam is a peaceful religion and quote verses in the Qur'an to prove it. However, it is well understood, by practicing Muslims that the Qur'an, the Hadith and the Sira all agree that these early, peaceful verses were abrogated (superseded) by later, violent and jihadist verses in the Qur'an. TAWRIYA

Tawriya is the act of creative lying and is exemplified by saying something that means one thing to an uninformed, non-Muslim listener and something entirely different to another Muslim. In other words, the speaker chooses words and phrases that technically support an alternate meaning thereby glossing over the truth and avoiding having to defend legitimate criticism of Islam and/or the Qur'an.
